No.1 for overall patient care



For the eighth time in 10 years, patients have rated Liverpool Heart and Chest Hospital as the best hospital in the country.

The results were recently revealed in the Care Quality Commission's National Inpatient Survey.

The thirteenth annual survey of adult inpatients looked at the experiences of more than 83,000 people who were admitted to 149 NHS hospitals across the country.

It considered areas such as admission to hospital, the hospital ward, doctors and nurses, care and treatment, operations and procedures, leaving hospital, as well as the overall patient experience. It aims to highlight what patients think about the care and treatment they receive and the feedback helps trusts to understand where improvements can be made.

As well as being rated top in the country for 'overall patient experience', the findings for LHCH showed that patients assessed it as the best trust in the country in a further five survey sections, as follows:

- Doctors
- Nurses
- Care and treatment
- The hospital and ward
- Waiting to get to a bed on a ward. The survey also found that we were rated first in the country in 14 other specific areas:
- waiting time from arrival at the hospital to being given a bed on a ward
- cleanliness of rooms, wards and bathrooms
- receiving understandable answers from doctors to important questions
- having confidence in the doctors and nurses providing treatment
- being well-looked after by hospital staff.

 LHCH, said: These exceptional survey
 results demonstrate once again that our
 patients recognise that they receive the very
 best care and treatment possible.

"We are enormously proud of this 'No 1 overall score', which is testament to the professionalism and dedication of our staff who devote all their energies into providing outstanding levels of care for every single patient as well as their family."



Congenital heart disease services for region to be centred in Liverpool

NHS England has announced that all patients who require surgery for congenital heart disease (CHD) including those with complex and life threatening conditions in the North West of England, North Wales and the Isle of Man will be treated in Liverpool.

A partnership of four Liverpool hospitals including LHCH, Alder Hey Children's Hospital, The Royal Liverpool University Hospital and Liverpool Women's Hospital will provide this specialist service ensuring a high quality service and a single and seamless pathway for patients of all ages with CHD.

LHCH was commissioned to provide a level 1 service for adult patients with Alder Hey delivering the level 1 service for paediatric patients.

Level 1 service centres will provide the most highly specialised diagnostics and care including all surgery and most interventional cardiology.

Jane Tomkinson, Chief Executive, said: "This is great news for patients across the North West, North Wales and the Isle of Man and we are pleased to have been recognised as a centre of excellence.

"We are delighted to be working with Alder Hey, The Royal and Liverpool Women's Hospital to ensure that patients across the region with congenital heart disease benefit from the highest standards of care and the delivery of safe and consistent services. We are confident that our longheld reputation for outstanding patient and family experience will enable us to deliver better outcomes for patients and significantly improve their quality of life into the future."

Cherry and Mulberry Ward officially opened by Sir Bruce Keogh

Sir Bruce Keogh, National Medical Director at NHS England, was delighted to formally open the new facilities at the event in May. It comes as part of a considerable investment made to expand the hospital's services for patients and families.





Cherry Ward is a new 10 bedded ward specialising in the care of patients, from the age of 16 years, with cystic fibrosis.

The ward was developed as part of plans to expand our services and to ensure that it was fully in line with the latest national guidance. We are delighted that all our patients with cystic fibrosis now have individual rooms with en-suite facilities, as well as a comfortable seating area and modern 'home from home' facilities.

Mulberry Ward has 12 side rooms, five of which have their own en-suite bathrooms, and provides care for pre-operative cardiac surgical and thoracic patients, and also looks after post-operative cardiac patients awaiting discharge.

The Ward is also home to our new Discharge Lounge, which was opened specifically to help ensure increasing numbers of patients are discharged home before lunchtime, instead of long waits that leave a poor impression after receiving otherwise excellent care and treatment.

LHCH showcase work on European stage

LHCH staff attended the 39th European Cystic Fibrosis Society (ECFS) Conference in Basel, Switzerland held between 8th and 11th June.

Nathan Hilton, Exercise Physiologist, and Catherine Whitty, Physiotherapist (pictured) both presented work at the conference. Nathan's work focussed on the relationship between cystic fibrosis (CF) patients' cardiorespiratory fitness, lung function and hospital admissions.

Nathan said: "Exercise therapy is an important part of a CF patient's routine care here at LHCH. Our findings support exercise testing an physical training in this patient group."

Catherine presented findings on a piece of work broadly looking at the benefits of using a specific drug (Cayston®) in CF patients over a 3 year period. Catherine said:

"There is little evidence to support the use of Cayston® on a long-term basis, emphasising the importance of our on-going monitoring of patients taking this drug."

Congratulations to Nathan, Catherine and the rest of the CF team for this work and showcasing these specialist findings on a European platform.

Member events


