It aims to provide accessible information and professional communication support to those who need it. The standard is designed to make sure that people with disabilities, impairments, or sensory loss can easily read or understand information.

AIS - refers to Accessibility Information Standards The Accessible Information Standard (AIS) is a law to make sure people who have a communication need due to a disability, impairment or sensory loss, to receive information in a way they can use and understand; and that they receive support to communicate.

Examples of AIS would be providing Braille, text to speech etc
